

Central Ethiopian Region/*Kilil*

The Central Ethiopia Regional State or *Kilil* is an amalgam of Zones and *Weredas* left over following public referenda that created three new *Kilils* that have splintered from the previously much larger Southern Nations, Nationalities, and Peoples' Region (SNNPR). It was created by default when the central portion of the old SNNPR split off to become the Southern Ethiopian *Kilil*. The South West *Kilil* and Sidama had previously declared their “*Kilildom*” following public referenda.

The Central Ethiopian *Kilil* is the largest (by population size) of the four newly formed *Kilils*/Regions with an estimated January 2024 population of 9,382,700 (Table 1). As the Guraghe constituted slightly more than half of the population in the 1994 census (the 1994 census was used to obtain the January 2024 estimates) in weredas and zones that formed the Central region, they may be expected to have maintained the slight majority status over the past 30 years. The other ethnic groups in the Central Ethiopian region include the Hadiya (population estimated at nearly 2.5 million) and the Kembata/Timbaro/Alaba (population estimated to be approximately 1.7 million).
